Some thoughts from the Astwell Benefice.....

Did you know that originally Advent was 40 days long? Back in the 4th century, when the Church started celebrating Advent the 40 days represented the 4000 years of patient waiting on the part of the Hebrews for the Messiah. In the 7th century the western church limited it to four weeks and decided it would start on the Sunday nearest St Andrew's Day.

All good facts for the next quiz, but more than that I hope it helps us to remember that the key to Advent is prayerful waiting. Waiting for the child that is King of All, waiting for the light of the world to come and shine forever. Each new church year we prepare and wait to welcome heaven's royalty into our hearts again. But like many New Year's resolutions, we too quickly revert back to our old ways and forget the high hopes we had of new beginnings at the start of the year. So this year make a permanent space, allow the light of Christ to fill up our whole lives, and through us, everyone we meet in the months and years ahead.

I'll finish with this Advent prayer from the other side of the world:
