Whit Sunday/ Pentecost Pilgrimage

On 19th May, Whit Sunday or Pentecost, we shall be making a pilgrimage round the churches of the Astwell Benefice, thus reviving an ancient Astwell custom. You'll find the timetable in this issue of Pews News. There will

be a Holy Communion service at Syresham with a baptism and brief prayer sessions in the other churches.

Please let me or a churchwarden/representative know whether you would like to take part in the pilgrimage. The whole journey is 18+ miles, so some people might only want to do a section of it. You may want transport to and from certain points on the route. If so, please make your own arrangements but tell us too in case some lift-sharing might be possible. If you would like to offer a lift or two on the day, or would be prepared to be on stand-by in case of emergency,

please also let us know.

People should bring their own lunch and other refreshments – and enough water (it will be possible to refill water bottles at some of the churches). The route will be on smaller roads, bridleways and footpaths and may be muddy in part, so serious footwear is advised – as is sunscreen, though it will probably be raining, of course!

Collects and Readings for Sixth Sunday of Easter

Collect:

God our redeemer, you have delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of your Son: grant, that as by his death he has recalled us to life, so by his continual presence in us he may raise us to eternal joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Psalm: 98

New Testament Reading: Acts 10. 44-end

⁴⁴ While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. ⁴⁵ The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, ⁴⁶ for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, ⁴⁷ 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' ⁴⁸ So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

New Testament Reading: 1 John 5:1-6

¹ Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. ² By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³ For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, ⁴ for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. ⁵ Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? ⁶ This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

Gospel Reading: John 15:9-17

⁹ As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. 10 If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. 11 I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. 12 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. ¹⁶ You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. 17 I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Post Communion Collect:

God our Father, whose Son Jesus Christ gives the water of eternal life: may we thirst for you, the spring of life and source of goodness, through him who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.
