#### From the Rectory

I am sure that many of you, like me will be outside wrapped up warm and gazing skyward in awe on Bonfire Night as Acorns do us proud once again with their firework display. \*

(By the way, don't forget to keep your pets safe and secure in doors as they, unlike us, won't enjoy the loud bangs!)

"Remember, remember the fifth of November "...the old rhyme goes; But it is not just the Gunpowder Plot we remember this month. November is also the time to remember all those who have laid down their lives for their country.

Originally two minutes of silence was observed "in all public spaces on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" to commemorate all those who had died in the First World War.

But less than 30 years later, Armistice Day had been renamed Remembrance Day and in the silence all those men and women who had died in the planet's Second World War were added to the list of those recalled.

Sadly, as the death toll in the "War against Terror" continues to rise, this year in the two minutes silence at our Village War Memorial Remembrance Sunday services we will also be remembering all those who have given up their lives in the many conflicts that have occurred since the "War to end all wars." Interestingly, a newspaper report of the first ever two minutes silence back in 1917 recalled:

"The first stroke of eleven produced a magical effect. The tram cars glided into stillness, motors ceased to cough and fume, and stopped dead.... Everyone stood very still ... The hush deepened. It had spread over the whole city and become so pronounced as to impress one with a sense of audibility. It was a silence which was almost pain ... And the spirit of memory brooded over it all.'

What a pity that while we stand and remember cars will continue to pass by and shouts will be audible from nearby sports fields.

Am I naive to think that, if the whole world were to pause for those two precious minutes and really think about the true cost of war, we might really be able to achieve "World Peace"?

Instead I will settle for asking all those who read this, whether or not you are able to attend our services, to pause for those two brief minutes and offer up a prayer, like this for peace:

O God of truth and justice, we hold before you those whose memory we cherish, and those whose names we will never know. Help us to lift our eyes above the torment of this broken world, and grant us the grace to pray for those who wish us harm. As we honour the past, may we put our faith in the future; for you are the source of life and hope now and forever. Amen.

We have a busy couple of months ahead at St Mary Magdalene and St Lawrence, Details of all our November and December services. are in this newsletter, there is lots going on for all ages and we would love to see you at any or all of them.

As for Christmas, I can't promise snow, reindeer or "peace on earth"; but I know that at our churches we will be doing our upmost to bring you a very Happy and Holy Christmas!

Meet the Churchwardens!
Ann Smith and Celia Terrey,
Churchwardens
St Mary Magdalene, Helmdon.

The present churchwardens for Helmdon are Celia Terrey who has lived in the village since she was born

and myself. I am Ann Smith and I have lived either in Falcutt or Helmdon since I married farmer Tony Smith in 1957. We both know a lot about present day Helmdon and also the traditions of the past.

Years ago it seemed to me that churchwardens were local dignitaries who almost thought it was their right to be a churchwarden and make all decisions with the Rector, who in those days, only had one parish.

How things have changed? Now the rector has 6 parishes and a lot of responsibility for the church is in the hands of the churchwardens. It is a very onerous but rewarding job.

Churchwardens meet with the rector and the PCC to make decisions about services, repairs to the building and the upkeep of the fabric in the church. There is also the question of how money is raised for that needs to be done including paying the large parish share. Of course churchwardens don't do all these things without help from PCC's and various committees and also villagers and many friends.

Churchwardens need to be accessible to many people. They are key holders and if by any chance the church is locked and someone needs to get in you drop tools and go and unlock. If repairs to the roof need doing you get a call from the builders to go and switch off the roof alarm. If you should be unlucky enough to have a crime committed such as metal stolen from the roof, or a break in, a churchwarden deals with the police. Of course these things hopefully don't happen very often but you have to be prepared to act promptly.

It is such a rewarding job most of the time and it is a wonderful feeling that you are part of the long history of people who have been guardians of your beloved church.
