Collects & Readings for Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity

Collect:

Almighty God, who called your Church to bear witness that you were in Christ reconciling the world to yourself:

help us to proclaim the good news of your love, that all who hear it may be drawn to you; through him who was lifted up on the cross, and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Old Testament Reading: Exodus 32.7-14

⁷The Lord said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; ⁸they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" ' ⁹The Lord said to Moses, 'I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. ¹⁰Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.'

¹¹But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, 'O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? 12Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. 13Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, "I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it for ever." '14And the LORD changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

New Testament Reading: 1 Timothy 1. 12-17

¹² I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, ¹³ even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, ¹⁴ and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁵ The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners - of whom I am the foremost. ¹⁶ But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost

patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. ¹⁷ To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel Reading: Luke 15. 1-10

¹ Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.' 3 So he told them this parable: 4 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninetynine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? ⁵ When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. ⁶ And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." ⁷ Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninetynine righteous people who need no repentance. ⁸ 'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? 9 When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." 10 Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who

- Whitfield Church has been busy recently. A beautiful and moving wedding the Thursday before last between Emelia Smalley and Anton Spires and a well-attended Benefice service three days later at which we heard of the work of Three Pillars feeding the hungry in Northampton. Aaron and Jo, the speakers, set us the challenge of becoming formally linked with Three Pillars. This would give us the opportunity to send volunteers to help with their evenings providing for the needy. Do contact me if you'd like to be involved in that.
- Whitfield cows joined the pilgrimage last Sunday afternoon, bolstering our rather low human and canine numbers. I think they may not have been much committed to the idea of pilgrimage, but they walked a fair way with us, eventually, however, I'm sorry to say, becoming a little threatening. I was glad of my Diploma in Cow Management gained under the tutelage of a vet in the Benefice of Witney and was able to ensure the survival of humans and dogs. We also weathered a stampede of silly sheep up by Pimlico.
- The low numbers of human participants in the pilgrimage was partly down to lack of sufficient notice. So here is notice of next year's pilgrimage. It will be on Saturday 23rd May 2026, the day before Pentecost, clear of the Let's Shine Together Festival, which will run from 30th May to 7th June 2026.
- These dates are fixed. More provisional, but worth pencilling in in your diaries, is **8**th **November (am)** for a discussion of Astwell Benefice becoming a single parish. We hope to have people from Witney Parish with us to discuss the pros and cons.
