

Collects & Readings for Last Sunday after Trinity

Collect:

Blessed Lord,

who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning:

help us so to hear them,

to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest them that, through patience, and the comfort of your holy word,

we may embrace and for ever hold fast the hope of everlasting life,

which you have given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Old Testament Reading: Ecclesiasticus 35:12-17

- ¹² Give to the Most High as he has given to you, and as generously as you can afford.
- ¹³ For the Lord is the one who repays, and he will repay you sevenfold.
- ¹⁴ Do not offer him a bribe, for he will not accept it;
- ¹⁵ and do not rely on a dishonest sacrifice; for the Lord is the judge,
 - and with him there is no partiality.
- ¹⁶ He will not show partiality to the poor; but he will listen to the prayer of one who is wronged.
- ¹⁷ He will not ignore the supplication of the orphan, or the widow when she pours out her complaint.

New Testament Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

- ⁶ As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. ⁷ I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. ⁸ From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing.
- ¹⁶ At my first defence no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them! ¹⁷ But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. ¹⁸ The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel Reading: Luke 18:9-14

⁹ He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: ¹⁰ 'Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax-collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax-collector. ¹² I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income." ¹³ But the tax-collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" ¹⁴ I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted.'

Post Communion Collect:

God of all grace, your Son Jesus Christ fed the hungry with the bread of his life and the word of his kingdom: renew your people with your heavenly grace, and in all our weakness sustain us by your true and living bread; who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

Benefice Bulletin for 26th October 2025

The last Sunday after Trinity brings to an end a long sequence of Trinity and after Trinity Sundays which began on 15th June. The liturgical colour for this season is green and this may be connected with Trinitytide's often being seen as a time for spiritual growth; we have relived from Advent to Pentecost the story of Christ's birth, death and resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit to the young church and in the Trinity season the hope is that, fortified and nourished by that story, we shall develop further as Christians. I wonder whether you can detect such growth in yourselves over the last four and a half months. It might be good to review the period to see whether you have grown, say, in your prayer life or in your love of your neighbour near and far; have you become calmer and more accepting in the face of adversity; has your trust in God grown? These are perhaps rather difficult discernments to make but you might, if you look, make interesting and encouraging discoveries.

I think I can detect growth in the relationship of the Benefice as a whole with God as we live out what is central to the ethos of the Let's shine Together Festival – an outward-looking generosity of disposition towards the other in our communities and beyond, a concern to give, which is of the essence of the God who is Love. That's why our agenda for the coming months and years has on it consideration of having a Parish Nurse and a Young People's Worker – ambitious aspirations but not clearly beyond us now. We'll see!
