

# Collects & Readings for Second Sunday before Advent

#### **Collect**

Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son was revealed to destroy the works of the devil and to make us the children of God and heirs of eternal life:

grant that we, having this hope, may purify ourselves even as he is pure; that when he shall appear in power and great glory we may be made like him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

#### Old Testament Reading: Malachi 4:1-2a

4 See, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble; the day that comes shall burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. <sup>2</sup> But for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings.

#### New Testament Reading: Thessalonians 3:6-13

<sup>6</sup> Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. 7 For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, 8 and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. 9 This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. <sup>10</sup> For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. 11 For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. 12 Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. 13 Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

#### Gospel Reading: Luke 21:5-19

<sup>5</sup> When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, <sup>6</sup> 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.' <sup>7</sup> They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' <sup>8</sup> And he said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them.

<sup>9</sup> 'When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.' 10 Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; 11 there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. 12 'But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. <sup>13</sup> This will give you an opportunity to testify. 14 So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; 15 for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. 16 You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. 17 You will be hated by all because of my name. 18 But not a hair of your head will perish. 19 By your endurance you will gain your souls.

#### **Post Communion Collect:**

Gracious Lord, in this holy sacrament you give substance to our hope: bring us at the last to that fullness of life for which we long; through Jesus Christ our Saviour.



### Benefice Bulletin for 16th November 2025

Consideration of the possibility of Astwell Benefice becoming a single parish will continue / continued (depending on when you read this) at our meeting 15<sup>th</sup> November, when the state of play in the Parish of Witney (4 churches) will be / was presented to us by one of its churchwardens. That Christ's Church should seek unity is an imperative derived from Jesus' prayer to his Father in John 17 that his followers may be one. Our meeting may help us to discern whether the unity of a United Benefice is sufficient or whether we should go further.

The cause of Christian Unity was furthered by the recent praying publicly together of Pope Leo and King Charles. On the other hand, also last month, schism between parts of the Anglican Communion was promoted - or maybe achieved - by Gafcon (Global Fellowship of Confessing Anglicans) when the Chairman of the Gafcon Primates Council said that Gafcon 'cannot continue to have communion with those who advocate a revisionist agenda' and declared that Gafcon is now the Anglican Communion. But then again John Henry Newman was declared a Doctor of the Church by the Pope on All Saints' Day. Archbishop Stephen Cottrell, a member of the Anglican delegation at the St Peter's service, spoke of 'the growing towards that full visible unity of which John Henry Newman, I think, is himself a saint and a sign; .... his theological vision was formed in the Church of England, and his writings as an Anglican are held as being equally important by the Catholic Church as his writings as a Roman Catholic.'

You win some and you lose some.

Another recent win for unity is the accession of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in the Faroe Islands to membership of the Porvoo Communion. Most of the other members of this grouping are Anglican Churches in the British Isles and Scandinavian and Baltic Lutheran Churches. Porvoo is a considerable ecumenical achievement and it's disappointing that the Church of England doesn't make a bit more of it.

And us? Our church membership is a fraction of that of the not-so-large Faroese Church (41K+), but, like them, we still have our responsibilities before God. Jesus prays for the unity of his disciples so that the world may believe that he has been sent by his Father. If greater unity would help our evangelistic efforts for Christ, we should pursue it.
